Check 21 and YOU

Beginning in October 2004, Federal law permits all financial institutions to recognize a new type of payment document called a “substitute check”. This means that this “substitute check” will be used for clearing and settlement of paper checks. The government, media and industry call this new ability **Check 21**. As you may have already seen with many merchants, to process your check, they simply scan it and give the check back to you as your receipt. The scanning device converts your check to an electronic image for collection purposes. Once the (1882301) image is transferred, the financial institution may collect from the image of the original check. Here’s what to know about Check 21 and you:

The “float” will disappear...

More rapid processing of checks will mean less float...the time between a check is written and when it clears.

Consumer rights are protected...

Protections for consumers have been built into the law and the regulations.

Check 21 should help combat payments fraud...

The faster collection and return of checks facilitated by Check 21 should reduce overall fraud in the check collection system.

Peanut Butter Bars

INGREDIENTS

- 2 eggs
- 2 C. oatmeal
- 2 C. flour
- 1 C. butter (melted)
- 1 C. white sugar
- 1 C. brown sugar
- 2/3 C. peanut butter
- 1 tsp. Vanilla
- 1 tsp. Baking soda
- 1 pkg. Chocolate chips

Cream butter, sugar, eggs and vanilla. Blend in peanut butter and add dry ingredients. Spread in greased 9 x 13 baking dish. Bake at 350° for 20-25 minutes. Sprinkle with chocolate chips and let melt.

FROSTING

- 1 C. powdered sugar
- 1/2 C. peanut butter
- 4 T. milk

Mix together and spread on cooled bars.
